Best Puppy In Show - Mr R & Mrs C Dix Beewye Penelope Pitstop Best Veteran Mr R & Mrs J Stone - Maynorth Simply Heavenly Puppy Dog Entered 3 Absent 1

1. Mr P & Mrs S Boyer - Gmacrystals Hint Of Jet – Tri boy coming up to a year, he has a lot of maturing to do, but is a promising prospect. Excelled in eye colour and shape, with lovely dome, needs more cushioning to finish. A bit roached in top line which on further examination I believe will improve. Love his rear angulation. His front should hopefully tighten-up as was a little suspect on the move. However, all in all he was of enough quality to gain Best Puppy Dog.

2. Mr S & Mrs G Smith - Alambra Here Is Magic For Justacharma – Similar age to my winner, he has done all his growing, but needs to develop into himself, when he does I believe he will make a nice picture, he has wonderful depth, with legs well set in. Heads often at this age need to come and he is no exception. Presented in wonderful condition and in gleaming deep Ruby livery. If I was solely judging on movement this young man would have gained to honours a joy to watch.

Junior Dog Entered 3 Absent 0

1. Mrs P Clarke - Stonepit Super Sydney For Poltomic – Really liked this tri boy. He sports a most melting expression, with dark eyes, well cushioned foreface and wonderful low set ears. He is spot on for size. Wonderfully short and deep with the potential of cobiness which is developing. Moved so well. In my opinion an exciting prospect for the future of the breed.

2. Mrs L House - Stonepit Earl Spencer At Triciaville – Sired by the same boy as my winner and similar comments apply. Not quite the head of my winner yet, but Blenheims are notorious for there slow maturity in this department. He looks slightly longer cast, however with more body this will all come together. I am sure he will gain confidence as he matures and should finish well.

3. Mr A & Mr M Carter-Davidson - Celxo Charles Dickens Novice Dog Entered 5 Absent 2

 Mr D & Mrs D Bailey - Aldoricka Smokey Robinson – Loved the size of this B/T boy, his gorgeous melting expression, and wonderful head construction. He is deep and well angled especially in the rear, which he used to advantage on the move. My criticism is that he is rather long and I wonder if he will grow into himself enough to compensate, time will tell.
Mr P & Mrs S Boyer - Gmacrystals Hint Of Garnet – very nice and promising Blenheim baby, litter brother to my BPD. Sweet expression with wonderful dark pigment. All the credentials are there for the future and I will watch him with interest along side his brother as he develops. Moved OK behind.

1. Mrs J Coupland - Tucherish High Treason – Class quality tri boy who owns the ring. He is just the right size, has such a typical and correct head with soft and gentle expression. Well put together throughout which provided him with the structure to drive around the ring. An exciting young dog.

2. Mrs P Clarke Stonepit Brave Bertie at Poltomic – So unfortunate to meet the winner as this tri boy is another quality youngster. In profile he is more cobby and deep.
